

Kilemi Mwiria was Kenya's Assistant Minister for Education (2003 – 2008) and Higher Education, Science & Technology (2008-2009). He was also a Member of Parliament during the same period. Previously, Dr Mwiria was an education consultant and academic in Kenya (Kenyatta University) and South Africa (University of the Witwatersrand). He lost his Kenyatta University job in 1994 for spearheading university staff rights having been the first Secretary General of the Universities' Academic Staff Union (UASU).

He holds a doctorate degree in international education from Stanford University, a master's degree in comparative education from the University of Chicago and a Bachelor of Arts degree from The University of Nairobi. He has published widely in the area of education and politics in both academic journals and the popular media. His most recent research has focused on higher education and education policy making in Africa, higher education and public accountability, education and insecurity and the role of e learning in enhancing higher education quality.
